1 Introduction

The MEDEA will make use of the “Communities of Practice” concept, to establish a network formed and operated by organizations whose mandate is to make the M&BS societies safer and more secure. Four Thematic Communities of Practitioners (TCP) active in the Mediterranean and Black Sea (M&BS) regions will be established in the predefined fields of:

1. TCP1: Management of migration flows and Asylum seekers;
2. TCP2: Border management and surveillance;
3. TCP3: Cross border organized crime and terrorism; and
4. TCP4: Natural hazards and technological accidents.

, aiming to interact sharing repertoires of procedures, resources and knowledge in order to address burning security challenges of the M&BS region.

As part of the DCO strategy, MEDEA Members, during the following five years, will organise an annual network meeting (with participation of projects and non-project partners) focusing on topics of interest to the network progress as well as they will also organise and/or participate in specific TCP meetings, events etc.

1.1 Structure of the Deliverable

Deliverable 7.13 has a public dissemination level (PU), thus it will be accessible by the public audience. In the second part of the report, the main activities (internal and external) of the period July 2018-July 2019 have been outlined, where MEDEA consortium members have either organised or participated in. 2 Overview of the events held during July 2018-June 2019

The main internal and external events where MEDEA members have organised and/or participated during the last year can be summarized in the following sections 2.1 and 2.2 accordingly.

2.1 Internal events

2.1.1 Kick-off Meeting, 28-29.07.2018, Athens

KEMEA being MEDEA Project Coordinator, successfully organized and hosted the project Kick off meeting, on the 28th and the 29th of June 2018 in Athens. During the Kick Off meeting, the MEDEA partners had the opportunity to thoroughly discuss the project's detailed plan and activities, to present and share relevant insights and findings, to review the necessary links and correlations between different tasks, thus having an overall view of the project's process and expected outcomes and shaping strong and long-lasting partnerships among them.

2.1.2 Consortium 6-month meeting, 05-06.12.2018, Brussels

The 6-months consortium meeting of MEDEA took place on the 6th and 7th of December 2018, at the premises of EOS in Brussels, with participation from 25 representatives from the MEDEA consortium. Its main objectives were to present the project status for the first 6 months, its achieved progress and ongoing actions, to map the MEDEA stakeholders, to outline the main points of the memorandum of Association as well as of the Monitoring & Collaboration activities among the MEDEA network, to contemplate on the cooperative scenario building and THOR analysis around the 4 specific Thematic Communities of Practitioners (TCPs) and to generally discuss around the structural, managerial, and procedural issues of the MEDEA

project, planning simultaneously their common future strategies for the next 6 months, towards the next Consortium meeting.

2.1.4 Joint Workshop on Land Border Security Needs and Challenges, 03-04.04.2019, Orestiada-Greece

The Center for Security Studies (KEMEA) and ISDEFE (Ingeniería de Sistemas para la Defensa de España S.A.) co-organized in conjunction with the EWISA Project partners a Joint Workshop on Land Border Security Needs and Challenges. The workshop took place in Orestiada, Greece, on the 3rd of April 2019. The workshop's objective was to bring together Border Guard Authorities (Romanian Border Police, Bulgarian Border Police, Albanian Border Police, Hellenic Police, Finnish Border Guards and Spanish Guardia Civil) operating at external EU Land borders. The 22 participating practitioners along with FRONTEX officers, elaborated and identified the operational capabilities required for more effectively securing and protecting EU borders. Aside from the prementioned representatives, over sixty (60) participants attended the demonstrations, as well as the EWISA Project Officer from EC – DG HOME, Research officers from EC – Joint Research Center, the Head of FRONTEX's Liaison Office for Greece & Cyprus, the General Regional Police Director and finally a number of high-ranking officers from the Hellenic Police.

2.2 External Events

2.2.1 OECD Workshop on NATECH, 04-07.09.2018, Potsdam

From the 4th till the 7th of September 2018, MEDEA's consortium members networked with NATECH experts e.g. from UN and OECD as well as on international level and JRC, during the OECD Workshop on NATECH in Potsdam, having as their main objective to get more precise information on the future scenarios in the NATECH area (TCP4).

2.2.2 Nicosia Risk Forum Event, 14.11.2019, Nicosia

On November 14th, 2018 the MEDEA project was presented in the Nicosia Risk Forum event in Cyprus, where the main objectives and drivers of the project have been presented and thoroughly discussed

2.2.3 European Forum for Disaster Risk Reduction (EFDRR), 21-24.11.2018, Rome

MEDEA Partners participated in the European Forum for Disaster Risk Reduction in order to network with the rest of the participants, thus get a grasp on black swan and grey rhino disaster scenarios in the EU e.g. earthquakes in the Mediterranean Sea, Volcano eruptions with subsequent disasters, to advance their knowledge on TCP-4 scenario building.

2.2.4 Security Research Event 2018 (SRE), 05.06.12.2018, Brussels

MEDEA project participated to the 2018 Security Research Event jointly organised by the European Commission and the Austrian Ministry for Transport, Innovation and Technology, the annual meeting where industry, governments and knowledge institutions come together to discuss the state of play and current challenges for security research in Europe, and where EU funded security-related projects are displayed in a large exhibition area. It attracted the interest of the majority of the participants (in total more than 800), who represented a wide range of security stakeholders: researchers, industry representatives, public security providers and practitioners (i.e. fire departments, police, border guards, intelligence agencies, etc.), as well as a wide number of policymakers from across Europe.

2.2.7 DAREnet Annual Dissemination Forum, 28.02.-01.03.2019, Budapest

On the 28th of February till the 1st of March 2019, MEDEA participated in the poster session of DAREnet Annual Dissemination Forum, in Budapest, where useful contacts with other projects like Heimdall were reinforced and new contacts e.g. with representatives of the cities of Antwerpen, the International Commission for the Protection of the Danube River / ICPDR were made

2.2.8 Forensic EXPO, 05.06.03.2019, London

On the 5th and 6th of March 2019, MEDEA partners participated to the Forensic Europe EXPO event in London, which is the only event of its kind dedicated to forensic science, attracting international forensics professionals from the Government, Law Enforcement, Laboratories,

Private Sector, Military, Legal Sector, Universities and Intelligence Sector, Forensics Europe connecting together the industry's entire supply chain and provide an all-in-one platform to engage with the most senior decision makers and procurement specialists.

2.2.9 MAGNETO 4th H2020 Project Meeting, 03-04.04.2019, Rome

On the 3rd and 4th of April 2019, MEDEA Consortium members participated to the Horizon 2020 Project MAGNETO (Multimedia Analysis and Correlation Engine for Organised Crime Prevention and Investigation): Research and Innovation Action project, which aims at empowering LEAs with superior crime analysis, prevention and investigation capabilities, by researching and providing tailored solutions and tools based on sophisticated knowledge representation, advanced semantic reasoning and augmented intelligence, well integrated in a common, modular big-data platform with open interfaces.

2.2.10 ILEANET Annual Workshop, 09-13.04.2019, Riga

On the 9th till the 13th of April 2019, MEDEA partners participated to the Horizon 2020 Project ILEANET (Innovation by Law Enforcement Agencies NETworking, which aims to set up and develop a sustainable network of Law Enforcement Agency (LEA) practitioner organisations from all over Europe. Based on interactive sessions showcasing research projects of particular relevance to "Tools, methods and good practices for conducting financial investigations to support investigations of serious organised crime, cybercrime, terrorism and illegally mediated migration", it aims to bring together LEA practitioners, academics and European project holders. The second ILEANet Public Workshop resulted in lively and expert exchanges between practitioners and the research community. It further provided an opportunity to reflect on possible barriers and enabling factors for the uptake of research output.

2.2.11 SmartResilience & SAYSO Joint Final Conference, 15.17.04.2019, Budapest

MEDEA Consortium Members participated in the joint final conference of the SAYSO and SMARTRESILIENCE projects that took place in Budapest during 15 – 17 April 2019. In the context of this joint final conference, MEDEA was presented to the conference participants during tradeshow and poster session.

2.2.12 "StrengtHening Intellectual Property and technology transfer processes in greEn sea mobiliTy secTors" - SHIPmEnTT project, 25.04.2019, Vlore, Albania

On the 25th of April 2019, MEDEA project was presented in the "StrengtHening Intellectual Property and technology transfer processes in greEn sea mobiliTy secTors" - SHIPmEnTT project, in Albania.

2.2.13 CMINE WILDFIRE TASK GROUP, 29.04.2019, Marseille

On April 29th, MEDEA partners participated in the meeting of the CMINE wildfire task group as observers, to identify synergies between MEDEA project and DRIVER+ project on forest fires

theme. This workshop, organized as part of the 6th Fire Behaviour and Fuels Conference organized in Marseille, was the occasion to finalize a roadmap towards “guidelines” for policy, science and practice, based on expert opinion and expertise, that provides food for thought to prepare the future steps in TCP4 work plan. The next step will be a workshop with stakeholders from the overall Mediterranean region.

2.2.14 Workshop Organization with French practitioners on Forest fires issues, 06.05.2019, Valabre-France

On May 6th, 2019, TCP4 organised a workshop in Valabre (near Aix-en-Provence) with four French local stakeholders of different fire brigades located along the Mediterranean coast. The objective was to present MEDEA and in particular the work planned as part of TCP4 and engage with them for the next steps of the project. The meeting was specifically focused on Forest fires. Categories of fires, scenarios, trends, emerging and future challenges (human, economic, environmental and legal) were discussed as well as main gaps and possible solutions. The next step will be a workshop with stakeholders from the overall Mediterranean Region.

2.2.15 MICRADS´19 – The 2019 Multidisciplinary International Conference of Research Applied to Defense and Security, 08-10.05.2019, Rio De Janeiro

MEDEA participated in the 2019 Multidisciplinary International Conference of Research Applied to Defense and Security (MICRADS 19), in Rio de Janeiro, from 8th till 10th of May 2019, where 2 relevant papers were also presented.

2.2.16 Preparation and cooperation with all Albanian Authorities in case of any event as, migration flows, Search & Rescue Operations in Adriatic an Ionian SEA, 23.05.2019, Albania

On May 23, 2019, MEDEA Partners participated in the “Preparation and cooperation with all Albanian Authorities in case of any event as, migration flows, Search & Rescue Operations in Adriatic an Ionian SEA” event with representatives from the Albania Coast Guard, Border Authority, Navy and Air Forces, and Customs Authority. The output of that meeting was to enhance participants’ readiness to face any potential migration flows incident and security of the borders.

3 Overview of the Upcoming events till December 2019

MEDEA project partners have identified a number of dissemination opportunities where they will be able to present the MEDEA outcomes, the most important of which are presented in the following section:

3.1.1 SAFEST National Festival, 07-09.06.2019, Cork

MEDEA project will participate with its own stand to the SAFEST National Festival, one of the most spectacular Irish maritime festivals with more than 100.000 participants, which aims not just to develop the marine economy but also to increasing participation and engagement by the citizens of Ireland with the sea.

3.1.2 The Migration Conference 2019, 18-20.06.2019, Bari

MEDEA partners will participate and present MEDEA's outcomes to the Migration Conference on 2019. This Conference will be a forum for discussion where experts, young researchers and students, practitioners and policy makers working in the field of migration are encouraged to exchange their knowledge and experiences in a friendly and frank environment. It is organised in thematic streams of parallel sessions focusing on migration, migrant populations, diasporas, migration policies, labor migrations, refugees, economic impacts, remittances as well as non-migrants and the wider impact of human mobility on sending, transit and receiving societies

3.1.3 WMIS 2019 - The 1st Workshop on Maritime Information Systems, 19-22.06.2019, Coimbra

MEDEA partners will participate to the 1st Workshop in Maritime Information Systems (WMIS 2019), which is dedicated to advancing knowledge and fostering the application of Maritime Information Systems (MIS). Its focus is on engaging researchers and industry in a dialog, which will result in stronger and more effective practical application of MIS, hence producing reliable systems based on state-of-the-art research results.

3.1.4 28th International Conference: Civil Protection and Disaster Management; Energy, Climate and Global Security in the 21st Century, 28.06.-02.07.2019, Burgas

MEDEA partners will participate to this international conference organized by the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences. The main topics that will be approached during the conference will be around the Energy, Climate and Global Security in the 21st Century, the Ecology of Air, Soil and Water, the Health and Safety as well as the Civil Protection and Disaster Management

3.1.5 European Consortium for Political Research (ECPR) Standing Group on Organised Crime, 05-06.07.2019, Sofia

MEDEA partners will participate to this conference, with its topic to be: "Dismembering Organised Crime: Identifying, Analyzing and Countering" and the focus of which is the different manifestations of modern-day organised crime, and the ways they are diagnosed, analysed, and examined. More in particular, it seeks to be a geographical and intellectual space where

international researchers, practitioners, NGOs think tanks and policymakers can collectively dismember organised crime together from its different levels, dimensions, aspects, heights, disciplines and countries. It seeks also to encourage the presentation of cutting-edge empirical research which intersects different disciplines and topics as well as a discussion around the most effective and efficient methodologies that can be used.

3.1.6 Table Top Exercise organised by the eNotice Project, 11.07.2019, Birmingham

MEDEA will participate to this event, upon invitation of West Midlands Police (WMP) and eNOTICE consortium. This event provides a great opportunity for emergency service responders and partners to work together to refresh and enhance their CBRN knowledge and effectiveness, to exchange their training best practices and generally to create a common vision of policymakers and development strategy for the CBRN training centers.

3.1.7 CoU 2019 Thematic Events organised by NO-FEAR EU project, 16-20.09.2019, Brussels

MEDEA partners will participate to the thematic events around Protection of public spaces, critical infrastructure protection, fight against crime and terrorism and border security, organised by another EU project, NO-FEAR. MEDEA could capitalize on the event's main desirable outcomes which are: to interact with ongoing projects, to identify capability gaps, to define user requirements and to indicate priorities as regards standardisation.

3.1.8 19th Annual Conference of the European Society of Criminology, 18-21.09.2019, Ghent.

MEDEA partners will participate to this conference, which will address topics that will become of major importance in criminology, criminal policy and crime control in the 21st century. With the expansion of city populations and the expansion of urban social life and public policy across many European cities, it is paramount to reflect on urban security/safety challenges that await European criminology, in terms of crime control, opportunities, terrorism and violent extremism, migration, criminogenic exposure and diverse forms of societal reaction to crime.

3.1.9 Multidisciplinary Field Exercise and Table Top Exercise organised by the eNOTICE project as part of their 2nd annual workshop and 2nd policy meeting, 20-24.09.2019, Dortmund

MEDEA project will participate, upon invitation of Fire Department Dortmund (FDDO) and Scientific and Research Centre for Fire Protection (CNBOP-PIB) and eNOTICE consortium to this event, the main objectives of which are the collection of user requirements, the research and development priorities, the exchange of training best practices and the networking for CBRN training stakeholders with other projects.

3.1.10 The 13th CBRNe Protection Symposium and the Exhibition of CBRNe protection equipment, 24-26.09.2019, Malmo.

MEDEA partners will participate to the CBRNe Protection symposium, which is aimed for engaged professionals within the CBRNe-protection field. As the world is constantly changing, this symposium is changing too. The CBRNe Protection Symposium, formerly known as the CBW Protection Symposium, has now grown to include the areas of protection against radiological, nuclear and explosive warfare agents along with the former chemical and biological warfare agents. An exhibition of CBRNe protection equipment will be arranged in connection with the symposium, where industry will show their latest products. The exhibition will offer a good opportunity for the symposium participants to make themselves acquainted with commercially available state-of-the-art equipment related to CBRNe protection

3.1.11 First International Scientific Conference "Digital Transformation, Cyber Security and Resilience" (DIGILIENCE 2019), 02-04.10.2019, Sofia

MEDEA partners will participate to the first of a series of DIGILIENCE conferences, which aims to establish the state of the art and future demands in the provision of security and resilience of processes, services and systems that are heavily reliant on information technologies. Of particular interest are studies that examine systems in their interdependence or place their operation in a human or wider policy contexts, as well as evidence- and data-based studies and presentations of the respective datasets.

3.1.12 MILIPOL 2019, 19-22.11.2019, Paris

MEDEA project will participate to the leading event dedicated to homeland security and safety. The event is organised under the auspices of the French Ministry of Interior in partnership with several governmental bodies. Milipol Paris owes its reputation to the consummate professionalism of its participants, its firmly international set-up (66% of exhibitors and 45% of visitors come from abroad), as well as to the quality and amount of innovative solutions on display. The event covers all areas of homeland security and it provides the perfect forum for presenting the latest technological innovations in the area, effectively meeting the needs of the sector as a whole and also addressing current threats and dangers.

4 MEDEA Annual Networking Event

As part of the Dissemination Communication and Outreaching Toolkit, MEDEA project is going to organise its first annual networking event, in November 2019, in Greece. This event will be a three-days conference, with participation of a variety of stakeholders (public authorities, NGOs, industry, security organizations, LEAs, etc.) as well as sister EU projects, focusing on topics of interest to the network progress, and addressing issues relevant to the four TCPs of MEDEA project.
